Outcomes

"Closing Declaration"

- Waste management should be a higher priority for politicians
- Financial sustainability for waste management services is important
- Setting up and monitoring their national target SDGs is necessary for an opportunity to increase investment for waste management both nationally and internationally.
- A platform to share information and promote partnership to achieve SDGs on waste management is necessary

All participants recognized a necessity of the continuous and expanded cooperation in Africa and the **formulation of a platform**, for sharing information and promoting partnership to achieve SDGs on waste management



2. Mission and Vision (draft)

The Mission, or the overall goal of the Platform is: African countries realize clean and healthy cities and achieve the SDGs on waste management by 2030.


SDGs on Waste Management

Target 11.6	By2030, reduce the adverse per capita environmental impact of cities, including by paying special attention to air quality and municipal and other waste management
	Indicator : Proportion of urban solid waste regularly collected and with adequate final discharge out of total urban solid waste generated, by cities
Target 12.5	By2030, substantially reduce waste generation through prevention, reduction, recycling and reuse
	Indicator: National recycling rate, tons of material recycled 5





- lacktriang Offering News related the Platform's Activities through SNS.



The regional office of the Secretariat will be considered to be located in Africa.



Function: Collaborating with the Secretariat to conduct all activities of the Platform






◆ Domestic Support Committee

Function: Supporting the Secretariat technically to conduct all activities of the Platform



African Countries




